The College Emblem

The circular shape of the wheel on the emblem represents the resolution of the college to be on the move always in its actions and activities on the road of its defined motto "Seek, Share, Serve." The sphere of darkness symbolizes ignorance in a human being which is to be dispelled by the light of knowledge and wisdom received through education. While lighted candles stand for education imparted in the college, it also symbolizes selfless and sacrificial service as exemplified by Jesus Christ, and stands for Christian vision and values. The blue colour on the emblem stands for truth, loyalty and fidelity.

Administration

The Alpha Arts and Science College is governed by the Management under the able leadership of Dr. Mrs. Grace George, the Chairperson of the College and Ms. Suja George, Vice-Chairperson. A team comprising the President & CEO, Principal and Vice-Principal effectively assists the management in all the administrative and academic matters.

Faculty

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Undergraduate Courses: Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination of 10+2 pattern conducted by the government of Tamil Nadu, AISSC, DSSC, CBSE, New Delhi and ICSE, New Delhi are eligible to apply.

Post Graduate Courses: Candidates who have successfully completed a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Madras or an Institution recognized by the University of Madras are eligible to apply.

CURRICULAR PROGRAMME

Each academic year shall be divided into two semesters. The odd semester shall consist of the period from June to November of each year and the even semesters from December to April of

each year. There shall be not less than 90 working days for each semester.

The main subject of Study for Bachelor Degree Courses shall consist of the following:

PART - II ENGLISH

PART - III CORE SUBJECTS

1. (a) Those who have not studied Tamil upto XII Std. and taken a Non-Tamil Language under Part-I shall take Tamil comprising two courses (level will be at 6th Standard).

(b) Those who have studied Tamil upto XII Std. and taken a Non Tamil Language under Part-I shall take Advanced Tamil comprising two courses.

(c) Others who do not come under (a) or (b) can choose non-major elective comprising two courses.

2. Skill based subjects (elective) - (Soft Skills)

PART-V EXTENSIONACTIVITIES

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:

A Candidate shall be awarded a maximum of 2 credit cards for compulsory Extension Service.

All the Students have to enroll for NSS / NCC / Sports and Games/ Roctract/ Youth Red Cross or any other Service Organizations in the college and have to put in Compulsory minimum attendance of 120 hours which shall be duly certified by the Principal of the college every year. If a student lacks 120 hours of attendance in the First year he/she shall have to compensate the same during the subsequent years. Literacy and Population Education Field Work shall be compulsory components in the above extension service activities.

EVALUATION

During the course of study, the evaluation of a candidate will be based on both Continous Assesment (Internal Assessment) and the End Semester Examination Weighing 25% and 75% respectively.

PASSING MINIMUM

There shall be no passing minimum for internal.

- For the external examination, passing minimum shall be 40% of the maximum marks prescribed for each Paper/Practical/Project and Viva Voce.
- The internal Assessment will have attendance as a component.

ATTENDANCE

Candidates shall be eligible to go to the subsequent semester only if they earn 50% attendance as prescribed by the University.

Lack of Attendance can be categorized as follows:

- If the candidate falls between 65-74% Attendance, he/she shall be subjected to a condonation fee as prescribed by the University.
- If the candidate falls between 50-64% Attendance, he/she shall not be permitted to appear to take the university examination. Candidates who put in less than 50% attendance have to repeat the course (by rejoining) without proceeding to the further year of study.
- In case of a woman candidate earning less than 50% attendance in any one of the semesters due to any extraordinary circumstances such as medical grounds, such candidates who shall produce medical certificate issued by the Authorised Medical Attendant (AMA), duly certified by the Principal shall be permitted to proceed to the next semester and to complete the course of study. Such candidates shall have to repeat the missed semester

by rejoining after completion of the final semester of the course, by paying the fee for the break of study as prescribed by the University from time to time.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PROCEEDING TO THE SUBSEQUENT SEMESTER

- Candidates shall register their names for the first semester Examination after admission to the UG courses.
- Candidates shall be permitted to proceed from the first semester upto the final semester irrespective of their failure in any of the semester examination subject to the condition that the candidates should register for all the arrear subjects of the earlier semesters along with the current semester subjects.

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE AWARD OF DEGREE

A candidate shall be eligible for the award of degree only if he/she has undergone the prescribed course of study in a college affiliated to the university for a period of not less than three academic years, and passed the examinations of all the six semesters prescribed earning 140 credits(in part I,II,III,IV AND V)

CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

(I)PART I/II/III: Successful candidates passing the examinations and securing (i) 60 percent and above and (ii) 50 percent and above but below 60 percent in the aggregate shall be declared to have passed the examination in the FIRST and SECOND class, respectively. All other successful candidates shall be declared to have passed the examination in the THIRD class.

(ii) PART-IV

Successful candidates shall be declared to have passed the examination on earning the credits prescribed.

(iii) PART-V EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:

Successful candidates earning the prescribed credit SHALL BE eligible for Classification/Ranking/Distinction.

RANKING:

Candidates who pass all the examinations prescribed for the course in the FIRST APPEARANCE ALONE are eligible for Ranking/Distinction.

In the Case of Candidates who pass all the examinations prescribed for the Course with a break in the first appearance , due to the reasons furnished in the attendance section are also eligible for classification.

TRANSITORY PROVISION:

Candidates who have undergone the course of study prior to the academic year 2009-2010 will be permitted to appear for the examinations under those Regulations for a period of TWO years i.e upto and inclusive of April/May 2012 Examinations. Thereafter, they will be permitted to appear for the examination only under the Regulations then in force.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

DRESS CODE

- The dress code for girls is Salwar Kameez/ Churidhar Kurta with duppatta neatly pinned (Short Churidhar and Tights to be avoided)

- Trousers and Shirts(tucked) and shoes for boys. They are expected to present a neat appearance (Clean-shaven, well trimmed hair)
- All the students must wear the college identity card inside the campus at all times.

COLLEGE TIMING

- The college timing is from 8.10 am to 2.15 pm
- All students must attend the assembly at 8.15 am.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- All students should be present on the reopening and last working day of each semester.
- Students should confine themselves to the classroom during class hours. They can visit the library only during the allotted hours and can go to canteen only during the breaks.
- Students should maintain decorum and discipline inside the classrooms.
- Students are strictly prohibited from entering the office room. They will transact all business across the counter.
- Students indulging in Ragging will be issued TC immediately.
- Students indulging in:

LEAVE RULES

- Students should not take leave without prior permission from the class in- charge.
- Leave of more than three days must be reported with a valid medical certificate.
- Absence for a single period will entail absence for half-a-day.

COLLEGE FEES

- College fees for the entire academic year to be paid either as a single payment in June or as 2 installments (June & November) on or before the prescribed date failing which a fine will be levied.

In case of prolonged delay the student's name will be removed from the roll call and he/she will have to be readmitted.

- In case the cheque is not realised then a fine of Rs. 1000

will be levied.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Parents are to be vigilant and keep track of the performance of their wards with the help of the department faculty.
- They are to contact the staff of the Department for remedial action whenever required.
- The College will issue Bonafide/any other certificates on receiving an application 2 days in advance on payment of the applicable fee.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

Monday-Friday: 8.30 am - 3.15 pm

Saturdays (Working Days): 8.30 am- 12.00 noon

Library Rules

- Strict silence must be maintained in the Library.
- Each student will be provided with two borrower's ticket, upon which he/she can borrow the library books.
- Students are allowed to keep the borrowed books for a period of two days.
- Books must not be marked or damaged in any manner.
- Books must be returned on or before the due date, failing which a fine of Rs. 5 will be collected.
- Loss of any book should be immediately reported to the librarian in the prescribed form available in the library. Students shall replace or pay the cost of any book lost by them.

- A fine of Rs. 100 will be charged towards the loss of a borrower's ticket.
- Reference books and Journals will not be issued.

HOSTEL RULES

- A hosteller will have to stay in the room allotted to him with two or three inmates.
- Inmates of the room are jointly responsible for the furniture and fittings in the room and the cost of the damage will be recovered from them.
- Hostellers are not permitted to cook food in the hostel. No posters, wallpapers, stickers etc should be pasted inside or outside the room.
- Guests, outsiders, day scholars are strictly prohibited from entering the hostel without prior permission of the warden.
- Any kind of wild, noisy and disturbing behaviour / celebrations in the campus is strictly forbidden.
- All Hostellers should maintain strict silence in the hostel during study hours.
- Any kind of misconduct/misbehavior inside or outside the campus and annoyance to the public will be dealt with severely.
- Bribing, gambling, giving fake declaration, spreading rumors, false accusation and writing / printing / disturbing / displaying unauthorized notices of any kind etc. inside or anywhere else are forbidden.
- Ragging of any kind and magnitude, smoking, chewing tobacco, alcohol consumption and the use of drugs are

strictly prohibited. Any hosteller found indulging in such activities will be expelled from the hostel with immediate effect.

- Hostellers are warned not to possess any valuables. The institution will not be responsible in the case of theft or damage.
- Hostellers are required to join the hostel after confirming that the facilities available are suitable to them. Hostel fee should be paid annually. The students are liable to pay the full year hostel fee in case they vacate the hostel at any time during the academic year.
- Application forms are to be submitted to the College office. The hostel-in-charge or warden should ensure that the application forms are complete in all respects with photograph, signature etc.
- Hostel is provided on a boarding and lodging basis. Hostellers cannot disengage boarding from lodging.

TRANSPORTATION

The college provides bus services at various pick up points in different parts of the city. All the students in their interest are expected to travel in the college bus. The girls who do not use the college bus should get written permission from the Principal for using any other mode of conveyance.

COLLEGE BUS RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Students shall opt for the conveyance in the beginning of the year by paying the annual fee in advance.
- Students should board the bus only at their boarding point and route number mentioned in their identity cards.
- Students should carry their bus identity card always and

produce it when demanded by the staff in-charge.

- Loss of the identity card should be reported and duplicate card will be issued on payment of Rs. 50.
- Students should strictly adhere to the seating arrangement instructed by staff -in-charge.
- Strict discipline and decorum should be maintained inside the buses. If students are found indulging in any indisciplinary activities, immediate action will be taken by the authorities.

Note: The College reserves the rights to withdraw the bus identity card in case of undesirable activities by the students.

TWO WHEELER PARKING FACILITIES

Students must possess the two wheeler driving license to use two wheelers as their mode of conveyance to the college. The vehicles must be parked in the allotted parking space. Application for the same should be submitted along with the driving license. Parking pass should be collected from the college office.
